

THE BOOK OF HEBREWS

THE BOOK OF HEBREWS: FOR US, BUT NOT TO US

If we place ourselves in the atmosphere of Hebrews the best we shall have is a combination of Davidic and Abrahamic honors, both far below what we have in fact. There is general truth of a non-dispensational character, in Hebrews, as there is in all parts of the Scriptures. The Son "through death is to destroy him that hath the power of death, that is the devil." That is

general as to the purpose of God and is not limited to a dispensation, but we must be careful how we read in matters of type and antitype.

THE "HEAVENLY CALLING" OF HEBREWS 3:1

The high priest is first mentioned in 3:1, where also a "heavenly calling" is intimated. Some have connected this with the heavenward or on-high calling (Philippians 3:14), i.e., the calling to the celestial realms, but the grammatical structure is quite different. In Hebrews 3:1 the thought is, that calling which emanates from the celestial throne, where the high priest is (Hebrews 9:24). Israel has no celestial allotment, and their priestly order and work is located on the Earth in the Millennial age. The Jews are to be a Heaven-designated Kingdom of priests for the thousand years (Revelation 20:6).

Paul's Jewish Epistles

As Daniel prophesied about the "abomination of desolation" (12:11, mentioned by Christ in Matthew 24:15), then Paul's mention of it in II Thessalonians 2:3 ("man of sin ... son of perdition") can't have anything to do with the events of this present dispensation of grace as related to the Church, the Body of Christ. This is further evidence that Paul's Thessalonian epistles are more specifically ap-

ISRAEL'S HOPE AND SIGNS
