DIVINE AWARENESS

Seeing God and His Creation with Enlightened Perception

For us, who love God, who are the called according to His purpose, there is an awareness that He is working all together for good (Romans 8:28).

The One Who is operating all in accord with the counsel of His will (Ephesians 1:11).

Regardless of how things may appear to the contrary, God is "working all together for good." This divine awareness is a priceless possession.

As our friend Mike Owens has wonderfully written,

God is working ALL together for good! Not for some, but everyone.

When Paul states "who love God," he is not saying that God is only working all together for good in the lives of those who love God. He is stating that those who love God are **aware** of this truth.

Our love for God brings "awareness"; it is NOT

Jim Coram shares great insight concerning Romans 8:28.

It is not only that God is working all together for *the good of* those individuals who are loving Him, but that God is working *all* together for good. Period. His operations for good are not confined to matters of our own welfare, but concern the best interests of all. They encompass all that exists and all that occurs. God is the Worker of all, for He "is working all."

Ephesians 1:11 declares that God (*Theos*, PLAC-ER) is operating (IN-ACTing) *all*. Romans 8:28 reveals that He is doing so for *good*. This is His *purpose*. Paul says that those individuals who are truly loving *the Placer* not only believe this but are *aware* that this is so.

Immature believers may love the "heavenly Father" while being very far from loving God, "the Placer" – "the only true God" or Subjector (John 17:3). God cannot be loved as God when He is not even recognized (much less glorified and thanked) as God.²

GOD IS OPERATING ALL

Life is far from being a random series of events. Rather, God is Elohim (Originator), Theos (Placer) and El (Subjector), and He is operating "all." Indeed, nothing is outside of His wise operation. He is,

The One Who is operating all in accord with the counsel of His will (Ephesians 1:11, Concordant).

The simple fact of the matter is that God is skillfully operating His plan (logos) to perfection and completion, and it is as good as done.

... the works were **finished** from the foundation³ *of the world* (Hebrews 4:3).

Consider what these able Bible teachers have said concerning these tremendous truths:

God is the Captain of the ship of the universe; all of His creatures are its passengers. — John H. Essex (1907-1991)

I would not abate one hair's breadth of God's supremacy – let the consequences be what they may. — Arthur P. Adams (1845-1925)

God is the God of certainty and not of chance, and He has "made up His mind," and the ages are working out His plan. — Alan Burns (1884-1929)

Since God works "all together for good," and operates "all in accord with the counsel of His will," there is nothing that is left out of His direction and control. This is because it all springs forth from His decree.

Let us briefly survey, with as few added words as possible, God's sovereignty in some of the basic operations of His creation.



In Belief and Unbelief

God Himself is absolutely behind all faith as well as doubt.

... *Faith* ... not of yourselves: it is the gift of God ... (Ephesians 2:8-9).


God Is Operating All Unbelief⁸

Without Form and Void: A Study of the Meaning of Genesis 1:2

by — Arthur C. Custance

Considered a classic in Christian apologetics, this scholarly analysis of the biblical phrase "without form and void," from the opening chapter of Genesis, observes the rules of linguistics, grammar and syntax, and also examines how words are used in the rest of Scripture. This book has been described as the best argument that has ever been written for the Gap Theory.

A well respected Canadian scientist, and listed in the 1971 American Men in Science, Dr. Custance contends that we should not allow science to determine what Scripture says. Neither should we allow Scripture to determine what the scientist observes in the laboratory. Yet observed fact in the one cannot, ultimately, conflict with revealed fact in the other. Any conflict, then, is in the interpretation of the facts – not in the facts themselves.

1:11 make the believer confident that *the best is yet to come*. This first part of our life is merely the elementary stage; faith rests in the grand sequel that awaits.

Paul puts the anticipation of the sequel as that which gives us the ability to undergo the severest of trials.

No trial has taken you except what is human. Now, faithful is God, Who will not be leaving you to be tried above what you are able, but, together with the trial, will be making THE SEQUEL also, to enable you to undergo it (I Corinthians 10:13).

Here are a few examples of the Scripture's declarations of creation's assured sequel.

I put to death and I bring to life, I have wounded and I will heal (Deuteronomy 32:39).

The LORD kills, and makes alive: He brings down to the grave, and brings up (I Samuel 2:6).

Come, and let us return unto the LORD: for He has torn, and He will heal us; He has smitten, and He will bind us up (Hosea 6:1).

He makes sore, and binds up: He wounds, and His hands make whole (Job 5:18).

You turn man to destruction, and [then] say, "Return, you children of men" (Psalm 90:3).

Thus, we are divinely aware that mortality looks forward to resurrection, sickness to health, sorrow to joy, imperfection to perfection, brokenness to whole-

ness, and emptiness to fullness.

THE RESULTS OF DIVINE AWARENESS

Among the greatest results of this divine awareness are relaxation, peace and ultimately thanksgiving.

Relax and know that I am God (Psalm 46:10, Concordant).

You will keep¹² him in perfect peace,¹³ whose mind is stayed¹⁴ on you (Isaiah 26:3).


What peace and rest are brought about in our lives by the realization of God's operation of "all." Listen to those who learned to bask in this awareness:

We have found the great secret of peace when we have learned to see the hand of God in everything. — J.R. Miller (1810-1883)

Happy is he who can see God in all things. — Arthur P. Adams (1845-1925)

Happy the man who sees a God employed in all the good and ills that checker life. — William Cowper (1731-1800)

With such divine awareness as our center, even those things which would have the appearance of "evil" in our lives and would naturally bring disappointment, discontentment and discouragement instead bring the fruit of thanksgiving.

"As to the Lord"

With the divine awareness that everything, including our most difficult circumstances, comes directly from the hand of God, Paul instructs us to do all "as to the Lord." He even extends this heart-attitude to one of the most difficult lots in life – that of being a slave. To the slave in particular he writes,

With good humor slaving as to the Lord and not to men (Ephesians 6:7).

Whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men (Colossians 3:23).

So, wherever we find ourselves, in whatever circumstances, we can see beyond our situation to the hand of God.

If you are enslaved, be a slave of the Lord. If you are an employee, be an employee of the Lord. Are you sick? Be a patient of the Lord.

Whatever you do, in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father by Him (Colossians 3:17).

"PAUL, THE PRISONER OF CHRIST JESUS"

Paul lived what he taught. Being found a prisoner of Rome, he looked beyond mere appearance, declaring himself to be in fact "the prisoner of Christ Jesus" (Ephesians 3:1). We see here the power of divine awareness.

In concluding these thoughts we are reminded of the following, poignant statement of A.E. Knoch (1874-1965).


