

THE ADMINISTRATIONS OF SCRIPTURE

Dominion Promise

Throughout Scripture we are presented with various administrations. These administrations, sometimes called "dispensations," or "economies," are divine managements, or stewardships.¹ (See endnotes.) They are the organization and implementation of a specific divine purpose.²

AN ILLUSTRATION

By way of illustration, it may be helpful to think of the various sequential administrations of human governments. Take the U.S. Presidency as an example: each have their own duration, emphasis and purpose – some long, others short in length;³ some wide and others narrow in scope.⁴ Some administrations progress through various stages of policy and agenda. Some have subset administrations opening

and closing within a particular administration, while others have administrations that have spanned out trans-administrationally.⁵

Some administrations extend, as it were, into other succeeding administrations, especially of the same political party,⁶ while other administrations have brought about abrupt and sweeping changes, having no semblance of past ones.

THE VARIOUS NUMBER OF ADMINISTRATIONS

How generally or technically one may approach the theme of administrations will determine how many one will likely enumerate. What often accounts for this diversity is that there are divine managements that clearly can be viewed as subsets working within major economies, as well as dispensations spanning

over multiple administrations.7

As few as two, and as many as eighteen, have been offered for consideration by diligent Bible students.8 For our purpose here we'll consider seven basic administrations, presented here in their sequential order.

- 4. Rightfully so or not, some presidents were dubbed "the donothing president" for their perceived lack of initiatives within the scope of their administrations. Among them were Fillmore, Hayes, Garfield, Arthur, Cleveland, Coolidge and Hoover. While others had administrations of tremendous scope – the most notable was the Franklin D. Roosevelt administration, termed "The New Deal."
 - 5. Again, taking the FDR administration as an example: some initiatives arose and folded with his term (such as the Civil Works Administration, the Public Works Administration, and the Works Progress Administration), while others have continued through succeeding administrations (such as the Social Security Administration and the Federal Housing Administration).
 - **6.** Such as the Johnson administration could be seen in some ways as an extension of the Kennedy one.
 - 7. "Some [dispensations] may overlap, and more than one can run together at the same time." - Charles H. Welch (1880-1967), Alphabetical Analysis

 - Clarence Larkin (1850-1924) totaled nine: Edenic, Antediluvian, Post-Diluvian, Patriarchal, Legal, Ecclesiastical, Judgment, Messianic, and Perfect (Dispensational Truth);
 - William B. Hallman (1902-1985) listed ten: Edenic, Adamic, Noahic, Abrahamic, Mosaic, Pentecostal, Secret, Tribulation, Millennial, and Fullness (Biblical Hermeneutics);
 - A.E. Knoch (1874-1965) and Adlai Loudy (1893-1984) counted twelve: Innocence, Conscience, Government, Promise, Law, Incarnation, Pentecostal, Transition, Secret, Wrath, Kingdom, and Fullness (Knoch, The Divine Calendar; Loudy, God's Administrations);
 - Charles H. Welch (1880-1967) wrote of eighteen: Innocence, Adam to Noah, Noah to Babel, Babel to Abraham, Abraham to Egypt, Exodus to Sinai, Sinai to Jericho, Jericho to Saul, David to Christ, the Earthly Ministry of Christ, Pentecost to Peter in Prison, Paul's First Ministry, Paul's Prison Ministry, The Resumption of Pentecost, the Day of the Lord, the Millennial Kingdom, the Great White Throne, The End - the goal reached: God all in all. It should be noted that οἰκονομία (oikonomia; G3622), rendered "administration" (CV) (KJV, "dispensation," "stewardship," "economy"), means "management of a household or family" (LSJ) "the management of a household or of household affairs" (TGL). Thus, how appropriate that all seven of these administrations all are centered on "households": The Adamic household, the Abrahamic household (the "house of Israel," "the house of Judah," etc.), "the household of faith," "the household of God" - "the whole family in Heaven and Earth." Hence, believers are referred to as "brothers."
- 11. This is the Dominion of Family. The dominion of the earth was vested in the family. The authorities were a husband and his wife. The perpetuation and increase in this domain was to be through their children (Genesis 1:28). God gave dominion to Adam and Eve (:26); but note (:28) that the subduing of, and continued dominion over the earth, followed "be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the Earth." As Adam and Eve had children, their dominion increased, and the authority naturally passed to them. Thus the dominion of the Earth was vested in the family.

The family here is not the nuclear family of contemporary Western culture, but the family governed by the patriarchal sys-



Nowhere in Scripture is there found the idea that each 'family' consists of two parents and 2.3 children living in a house on a lot 100 by 60 feet and as an isolated unit, with 'King and Queen' and a three-bedroom home as their little 'castle.' In the Bible, the family was too broad and too important for such isolation ... Actually, the concept of the 'nuclear' family of today - the typical two generation nuclear family of parents and children characteristic of contemporary Western society – is not only foreign to the Bible; it is relatively new in the history of America as well ..." — Terry & Beverly Miethe, Serving Christ: A Family Affair (Joplin, MO, College Press, 1995) pages 178-179.

Family dominion continued unaltered for nearly two thousand years before its usurpation by nationalism, and although it remains through subsequent administrations, it does so in a weakened and frail state.

The oldest writing of Scripture is the book of Job, where he clearly wrote of his earthly resurrection expectation:

For I know that my Redeemer lives, and that He shall stand at the latter day **upon the Earth:** and though after my skin has been destroyed, yet **in my flesh** shall I see God: Whom I shall see for myself, and mine eyes shall behold, and not another, though my heart be consumed within me (19:25-27).

- 18. I.e., The Kingdom of the Heavens on Earth.
- 19. It is important to understand this exception. God stopped Israel's prophetic clock at the end of the Acts Period, thus interrupting the prophetic program entirely and ushering in an unprophesied Dispensation of the Grace of God. This previously unknown purpose was called "the Secret," and its management "the Administration of the Secret" (Ephesians 3:9).


During the current "Administration of the Secret" Israel and her prophecies are in complete abeyance. During this time Christ is seated at the right hand of God, "far above all heavens" (Ephesians 4:10), where He remains until the time appointed by His Father for Him to begin His work "among the Celestials." At this unprophesied time, ordained by the Father, Christ will be

- manifest "in Glory," "among the celestials," "far above all heavens." It is at this time that His Body will accompany Him there for a joint-appearance (the entire Christ the One Body with its Head). Then will begin the *pre-expectant* ministry of Christ Jesus among the Celestials through the instrumentality of His fullness (i.e., He, complete with His Body).
- **20.** And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing (Genesis 12:2).
- **21.** And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the Earth be blessed (Genesis 12:3).
- 22. The "meek" among Israel and the Nations will "inherit the Earth" (Matthew 5:5). They will be given an earthly allotment as their glory. These are Abraham's "dust" and "sand" seed (Genesis 13:16; 22:17; Hebrews 11:12): all of those who were "just" in their dealings with others (Romans 2:6-7).
- 23. The heavenly sphere is that of the "New Jerusalem" "descending out of Heaven from God" (Revelation 3:12; 21:2, 10), and is for all of those who are "of the faith of Abraham" (Romans 4:16) those who are "Abraham's seed, heirs according to the promise" (Galatians 3:29). These are those among Israel and the Nations who have their "calling" of hope prior to Acts 28:25.

This second-sphere election makes them "partakers of a heavenly calling" (Hebrews 3:1). Like their spiritual father, Abraham, they "looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God" (Hebrews 11:10; cf. 12:22-23).

The New Jerusalem will be the administrative capital of Israel's worldwide Kingdom on Earth (Zechariah 14:16-17). This is the sphere of Abraham's *spiritual* seed, which included believing Gentiles during the Acts Period (Galatians 3:29). Unlike the "meek" and "good" among Israel and the Nations who will "inherit the Earth" (Matthew 5:5), these have been granted the faith of their father, Abraham, and have become destined to be his second-sphere "star" seed, contrasted with his first-sphere "dust" and "sand" seed (cf. Genesis 15:5; 22:17; Hebrews 11:12).

These second-sphere "star" seeds make up "the Bride, the Lamb's Wife" (Revelation 21:9). They are God's called-out-ones who had a fixed hope before the current Secret Administration. They were the believers who were represented by "the ecclesia in the wilderness" (Acts 7:38), those built upon the confession of Christ's Messiahship ("upon this rock will I build My ecclesia," Matthew 16:18), whose number were added to on a daily basis during the Acts Period (Acts 2:46-47), and which Saul relentlessly persecuted ("persecuted the ecclesia of God," I Corinthians 15:9; Galatians 1:13). These are those "called" who will be citizens of that heaven by city coming out of Heaven to the Earth (Revelation 3:12; 21:9-10). While Israel rules over the Earth, the Twelve and the rest of the Bride will rule over Israel from the New Jerusalem.

- 37. Paul had an early, prophetic, priestly ministry (diakonia, G1248) to the members of the nations (Romans 11:13, cf. Galatians 2:7; II Corinthians 4:1) which purpose was to provoke Israel to emulation (Romans 11:14). It was a ministry of grace (Acts 20:24), spirit (over against death, II Corinthians 3:7-8), righteousness (over against condemnation, :9), and conciliation (5:18). - 42. The doctrine of the one body is never referred to by any other apostle than Paul. He calls it "the Dispensation of the mystery" with which he had especially been entrusted [Ephesians 3:9]. ... Jew and Gentile being formed by the Spirit into one body ... was a truth never before made known. The Old Testament will be searched in vain for it. It is not there, because it was "hid in God" [3:9]. The recognition of but one body and one Head ... leaves one outside of all human systems, and apart from all recognition of human heads. "The Church must have a head!" was the Romanist's challenge to Luther, as he began to set forth the claims of the Papacy. "Yes," replied the mighty champion of the reformation, "and that Head is Christ!" H.A. Ironside (1876-1951) Sailing with Paul (1913), chapter 10
- **43.** While God certainly blessed Israel with many physical blessings on Earth, our lot is that of being blessed "with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ" (Ephesians 1:3, KJV), "every spiritual blessing, in the heavenlies" (REB), "every spiritual blessing among the Celestials" (CV). Thus, unlike Israel, we are "disposed to that which is above, not to that on the Earth" (Colossians 3:2, CV).
- 44. Grace is the undeserved and unrecompensed favor of God. Grace cannot be withheld because of unworthiness (Romans 4:5-8). Pure grace cannot be exercised where the slightest degree of human merit or goodness is recognized. Grace cannot be lessened because of unworthiness. Much sinfulness calls for much grace (Romans 5:20-21).

We will often hear about the danger of carrying God's grace too far. Nonsense! The fact is that we could not possibly carry grace any further than God has already carried it! "Yet where sin increases, grace superexceeds" (Romans 5:21, CV).

This Scripture passage is clear: When sin accelerates, grace goes into overdrive. God's grace will never be outdone! It will EVER super-exceed the measure of sin.

45. This secret "appearing" and subsequent work among the Celestials were completely unknown to Jewish prophecy. This ap-

pearing of the completed Christ (Head and Body) will take place prior to the reestablishment of Israel's prophetic program, and thus, prior to any prophetic passages dealing with the events surrounding Christ's return, coming to the Earth.


At an unprophesied time, with Israel's prophetic clock still motionless, Christ will reveal Himself among the Celestials. His Body will join Him there in His appearance as co-regents, the new aristocracy of the Super-Heavens. This manifestation has no prophetic signs or indicators pointing to its arrival. This celestial experience will pre-date the so-called "rapture" or "snatching away" taught in I Thessalonians 4 (along with the voice of Israel's archangel and its prophetic "trump" of :16).

Under "the Administration of Secret," our hope is "pre-expectant." In other words, our hope comes first, before the descent of Christ to the Earth. In fact, it is our righteous occupation and rule among the Celestials that will later facilitate the necessary conditions that will prevail from the Heavens upon the Earth. Paul tells us that under "the Administration of the Secret" we "are pre-expectant in the Christ" (Ephesians 1:12, CV).

Being that our hope is unprophesied, there are then no timetables for it *whatsoever*, thus we have no way of knowing how long it predates the descent of Christ's return to the Earth. All we know is that the hands of Israel's prophetic clock are now silent and still, and that they will not resume until our appearance with Christ among the Celestials, in Glory, has been accomplished. At some point *after* our hope has been realized, God will again resume His prophetic dealings with Israel and the Nations.

- 47. Paul's "my gospel" is the premier evangel concerning Christ's grand work at Calvary. It is a glorious revelation that began being declared at his divine separation in Acts 13. This gospel continues to this day. Thus, Paul's gospel spans both a portion of the Pentecostal Administration (from Acts 13-28) and all of the Secret Administration. Additionally, Paul's gospel – "the gospel of the grace of God" (Acts 20:24) - will ultimately be the future basis of God's worldwide judgement (Romans 2:16), which will be the setting of all things right – the correction of everything.

It must be remembered that "gospels" and "administrations" are not the same thing, so it should almost go without saying that there is a difference between Paul's Gospel and the Secret Administration – one is a gospel; the other is an administration. Some of the most advanced students of Scripture have failed to make this clear distinction. This failure to "rightly divide" between the two has resulted in much confusion, even among dispensational teachers. For look at their distinctions, see:

- 48. Currently, Israel and her early Kingdom hope are in abeyance. Yet, all of creation still has as their premonition the baseline earthly glory. Yet, for the believer of Paul's gospel, the third sphere is the unique calling of the One Body "among the Celestials." The revelation of this pinnacle sphere is found only in the letters of Ephesians and Colossians. This phrase, "among the Celestials," is exclusive to the book of Ephesians (1:3, 20; 2:6; 3:10; 6:12, CV). These two epistles unveil the Secret Administration (Ephesians 3:9) and its sphere of glory "far above all Heavens" (Ephesians 4:10) where Christ sits "in Glory" (Colossians 3:4) "at the right hand of God" (:1), and where we will one day "appear with Him" (:4). "The administration of God which is given to [Paul] for [us]" makes "Christ in [us], the hope of Glory" (Colossians 1:25-27).

The Lord Jesus Christ has been given "all authority, in Heaven and on Earth" (Matthew 28:18, REB). His Body will have jurisdiction over all spheres. Our seated dominion - "among the Celestials," "far above all Heavens" - is that of ruling jointly with Christ in and from the Super-Heavens, with universal jurisdiction extending even over the Earth.

The Heavens are above the Earth, not just physically, but governmentally. A part of the powerful message learned by Nebuchadnezzar was that the Heavens have "jurisdiction" (CV) or "dominion" (REB), "ruling" (YLT) over the Earth and its kingdoms (cf. Daniel 4:26).

While Israel rules over the Earth, and the Twelve and the rest of the Bride rule over Israel from the New Jerusalem, we will be joint regents with Christ ruling over the entire Universe.

49. The only other administration continuing during the Secret Administration is the baseline, non-prophetic administration of the family (Ephesians 5:22-6:9; Colossians 3:18-25).


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
