The "Out-Resurrection"

If by any means I might attain unto the resurrection of the dead (Philippians 3:11).

If by any means I may advance to the earlier resurrection, which is from among the dead (REB).

... the resurrection that is out from among the dead (CV).

... the out-resurrection: from the dead (PNB).

The Greek word used to translate "resurrection" here in Philippians 3:11 is ἐξανάστασις (*exanastasis*),¹ which E.W. Bullinger's *Companion Bible* translates as the "out-resurrection." This is a compound word: *anastasis*, the common Greek word "resurrection," with the added Greek prefix *ex* – meaning "out."



Israel was set aside.³ He wrote four letters afterwards.⁴

Philippians was the first letter written after the close of the book of Acts, after Israel had been set aside, but before the current Secret Administration⁵ was revealed in Ephesians. When Paul wrote Philippians, Israel was already in abeyance, and he was then found pressing toward "the high calling of God in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:14).

Philippians 3:11 is the only occurrence of *exanastasis* in Scripture. It refers to a prior resurrection than the one that was the hope of Paul's earlier epistles (*i.e.*, in I Corinthians and I Thessalonians). This out-resurrection is an integral part of the "prize of the high calling"² which Paul pressed toward.

Rather than being a part of the Secret Administration, Philippians stood on the threshold of the grand Ephesian-Colossian writings. Philippians was the gateway epistle to the Celestial writings of Paul.⁶

This "out-resurrection" is what will unite the "Ecclesia, which is His Body" to its Head. This will take place when He is made *manifest* among the Celestials, at the right hand of God, "far above all Heavens" (Colossians 3:4; Ephesians 1:20-21; 4:10).

Acts 28:28 is the dispensational dividing line of Paul's fourteen epistles. Paul wrote ten letters during the time-period covered by the book of Acts, before

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Although Paul was in an “in-between” state, with Israel in abeyance and the Secret Administration not yet revealed, he was pressing forward with great confidence.

Being confident of this very thing, that He Who has begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ (Philippians 1:6).

In Philippians 3 Paul is dealing with the old things (found in his prior epistles) that he is leaving behind, and is now pressing toward the attainment of that which is new (about to be revealed in Ephesians and Colossians). In Philippians he is paving the way for the cessation of his old standing and hope, and leading the way to a far superior one.

Paul willingly surrendered the hope of the Acts Period, and his earlier epistles, to *attain* the higher calling (over-heavenly), which included the “*out-resurrection*.”

This “*out-resurrection*” involves two new things:

- (1) a different *sphere* of hope – the super-heavenlies, and a different timing of hope;
- (2) an earlier hope – a pre-expectancy in the Christ (Ephesians 1:12, CV).⁷

When Christ, Who is our life, shall appear, then shall you also appear with Him in glory (Colossians 3:4).

The Greek word translated “*appear*” in the KJV is φανερώω (*phaneroō*),⁸ which means to be made manifest, and is so translated in various literal translations (CV, REB, YLT).

E.W. Bullinger (1837-1913) wrote concerning this *out-resurrection*:

Our *exanastasis* ... will precede the resurrection spoken of in I Thessalonians 4:18. When we receive [the realization of] the *exanastasis* of Philip-

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pians 3:11 we shall leave I Thessalonians 4:18 to be fulfilled in those who will believe after we have been *called on high*.

We shall not take our Bibles with us and deprive those who are left behind of all hope. Those who are taken out of the great tribulation, and those who are seen in Heaven in Revelation 5:9-17 must have gotten there in some way ... and there is no other way of getting there but by resurrection ...

There is the mention of a “trump” in Matthew 21:31; I Thessalonians 4:16; and I Corinthians 15:52 – but there is no sound of a trumpet mentioned or needed in connection with our *heavenward call* (Philippians 3:14).⁹

Paul’s opening expression of Philippians 3:11, “*if by any means*,” did not express any doubt whatsoever in his mind that he would *attain unto the out-resurrection*. Rather, it reveals his steadfast confidence that *nothing* would stand in his way of “*apprehending*” (or “*grasping*”) that for which he had been “*apprehended of Christ Jesus*.”

Not that I already obtained, or am already perfected. Yet I am pursuing, if I may be grasping also that for which I was grasped also by Christ Jesus (Philippians 3:12, CV).

Paul obtained that perfection which he *pursued* – the pinnacle revelation of Ephesians. He *grasped* hold of that for which he had been truly grasped by Christ Jesus. He reached the summit of divine revelation, and with the writing of Colossians, the twin epistle of the Secret Administration, he completed (finished) the Word of God (Colossians 1:25, CV)!

One preordained day, Who and what Christ truly is will be made manifest – at His throne of His Glory, at the Father’s right hand. At that time, we will be resurrected, so that who and what we truly are will also be manifest with Him, our Head, making us the first group of believers to be *resurrected out from among the dead*.

If by any means I may ADVANCE to the earlier resurrection, which is from among the dead (Philippians 3:11, REB).

Press forward with Paul, out of the Acts period, beyond Paul’s earlier letters, into the grand and glorious conclusion of Fullness (the *Plērōma*)!¹⁰ **BSN**

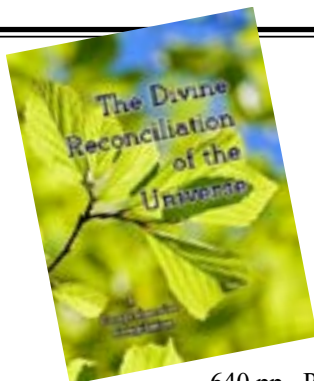

The Delusion of Free Will

Sam Harris

Sometime last year our dear brother and friend [Mike Owens](#) introduced us to a video compilation of Sam Harris, *The Delusion of Free Will*.¹ Harris is a neuroscientist, who holds that “free will is an illusion.”

Mike wrote that this video was “worth 2 or 3 viewings to soak it in.” I would agree. Mike also added, that, “it's interesting that this atheist (perfectly designed by our Creator) is explaining so well the same truths that God has shown us.”

Though not a believer, in his video compilation, I counted eight times that he used the word “author,” as in “we are not the authors of our thoughts

and actions.” His use of the word “author” so many times seems to me to beg the question, if we are not the author of our thoughts and actions, then who is?

While reading his book *Free Will* (Free Press, 2012) I marked some very interesting sections, which I will now share with our readers (emphasis mine.)

Free will is an illusion. Our wills are simply not of our own making. Thoughts and intentions emerge from background causes of which we are unaware and over which we exert no conscious control. (p. 5)

The popular conception of free will seems to rest on two assumptions: (1) that each of us could have behaved differently than we did in the past, and (2) that we are the conscious source of most of our thoughts and actions in the present. ... Both of these assumptions are false. (p. 6)

Our sense of free will results from a failure to appreciate this: We do not know what we intend to do until the intention itself arises. To understand this is to realize that we are not the **authors** of our thoughts and actions in the way that people generally suppose. (p. 13)

Most of us *feel* that we freely **author** our own thoughts and actions ... Thus the idea of free will emerges from a *felt* experience. (p. 15)

At the End of the Ages: The Abolition of Hell

by — Bob Evely

Is hell forever? Most say that the righteous go to heaven, and the wicked to hell, *forever!* Is this what the Bible teaches?

This book presents evidence that the Bible, in the original languages, reveals that, one day, *ALL* mankind will be saved. Through time our Bible translations have become biased through the official teachings of “The Church.” The author argues that teaching about an eternal hell slanders God, and it prevents many from having faith because the arguments in support of an eternal torment are illogical.

Would a God of love keep many souls alive *forever* just to torment them because they failed to “accept Jesus Christ” in this lifetime? The author shows that the Bible does *not* teach this. The purpose of “the eons” (*i.e.*, “the ages,” often mistranslated “eternity”) is to bring *ALL* mankind to the point where every knee bows before Him. This work is written with the average reader in mind.



At this moment, you are making countless unconscious “decisions” with organs other than your brain – but these are not events for which you feel *responsible*. Are you producing red blood cells and digestive enzymes at this moment? Your body is doing these things, of course, but if it “decided” to do otherwise, you would be the victim of these changes, rather than their cause. (p. 23)

People *feel* (or presume) an **authorship** of their thoughts and actions that is illusory. (p. 24)

Take a moment to think about the context in which your next decision will occur: You did not pick your parents, or the time and place of your birth. You didn't choose your gender, or most of your life experiences. You had no control whatsoever over your genome, or the development of your brain. And now your brain is making choices on the basis of preferences and beliefs that have been hammered into it over a lifetime by your genes, your physical development since the moment you were conceived, and the interactions you have had with other people, events, and ideas. Where is the freedom in this? (p. 41)

You will do whatever it is you do, and it is meaningless to assert that you could have done otherwise. (p. 44).

I'm not especially worried about degrading the morality of my readers by publishing this book. Speaking from personal experience, I think that losing the sense of free will has only improved my

ethics – by increasing my feelings of compassion and forgiveness, and diminishing my sense of entitlement to the fruits of my own good “luck.” (p. 45)

Many seem to have absolutely no awareness of how fortunate one must be to succeed at anything in life, no matter how hard one works. ... Even if you have struggled to make the most of what nature gave you, you must still admit that your ability and inclination to struggle is part of your inheritance. (pp. 61-62).

Our *sense* of our own freedom results from our not paying close attention to what it is like to be us. (p. 64).

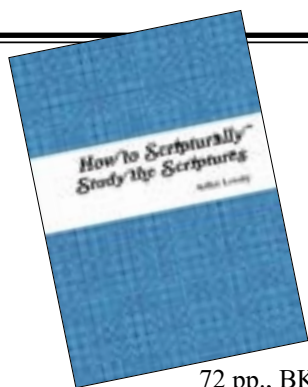

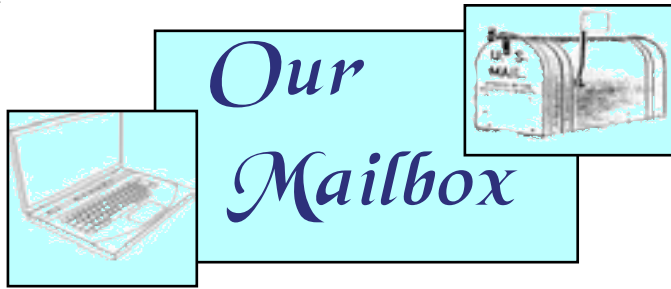

You also being dead **TO** the offenses (Colossians 2:13).

[*Edited Excerpt:*] We were chosen in Christ before the disruption of the world to be holy and flawless in His sight (Ephesians 1:4). Our saintliness was ours in God's purpose long before we had sinned. So it is with this grace also. When Christ died, we died with Him. When He was roused and vivified, we were in Him, and we ascended and sat down among the Celestials in Christ Jesus. Let us not blur this marvelous truth by imagining that all this occurs for each individual after becoming dead through sin, or in trespasses. Death is oblivion. We were dead to everything before we were born. All these high honors were ours before we could make or mar them. They are absolutely independent of our conduct. ...

Such a slight inaccuracy in translation has robbed us of the grand truth of our death **TO** sin in His death. It has substituted the popular but erroneous "*dead in trespasses and sins*" and applied it indiscriminately to all sinners, who are not in view in this connection at all.
