## Does God's Cove for Humanity Extend Beyond the Grave?

Love never ends (I Corinthians 13:8, HCSB).

n the surface the question before us may appear silly until one considers Christianity's teaching on the subject. Certainly, most proclaim the reach of God's love beyond the grave, but this love is reserved only for those who have "taken Jesus as their Savior," "prayed the sinner's prayer," or done any number of things that the religious system requires for a person to have a right relationship with God.

Christianity ties God's love to a religious performance system which is *uns*criptural for the "Administration of the grace of God" in which we live (Ephesians 2:8-9; 3:2, CV).

Thankfully, God's love and care for His creation is never ending, reaching far beyond death and the grave. Neither pose the slightest hindrance to His love, or to the completion of His purpose and plans, for they both are actually part of the destiny in Christ that He has planned for ALL of

His sentient creatures (I Corinthians 15:28).

Religion would have you think that death is final, and that everything is "set in stone" from the point of death onward. The idea is that God is somehow constrained by death, and that He is thus powerless to do anything after death, even though He really wants to. If this were true, death would leave God impotent.

Yet Scripture denies this, for Revelation 21:4 declares,

 $\dots$  death will be no more  $\dots$  (CV).

## 1000<sup>th</sup> Issue of the Bible Student's Notebook!

**34 YEARS AGO,** in the spring of 1989 we wrote, laid out, printed and mailed the first issue of the *Bible Student's Notebook*. We never imagined the day that we would release the 1000<sup>th</sup> issue, or of the journey that would have brought us here. Would we have been so intimidated by such prospects that we never may have begun?

As printed on the masthead of every issue, the main thrust of the *BSN* has always been to be "the Herald of His Grace." In that very first issue we laid out our purpose, attitude and goal. Here is what was written in the editorial.

#### **PURPOSE**

It is our belief that every voice that can speak out for God's glorious grace needs to! The message of Paul's distinct ministry must go out as far and as wide as possible.

### **ATTITUDE**

We have no corner on truth, nor does anyone else. None possesses "all truth" infallibly. Therefore, we seek to fellowship with all those who love the Lord Jesus Christ and take pleasure in His precious Word.

The first issue of the BSN was mailed to a mailing list of over 3000 to 38 states and 13 foreign countries. Before it went exclusively digital, we would have distributed over 100,000 copies of the BSN through the mail. What began as an occasional periodical became a weekly in December, 2007.

We agree with the words of George Whitefield (1714-1770), when he said,

I truly love all that love the glorious Emmanuel, and though I cannot depart from the principles which I believe are clearly revealed in the Book of God, yet I can cheerfully associate with those that differ from me, if I have reason to think that they are united to our common Head.

We desire to avoid destructive "uniformity" and allow for differences of opinion. We don't expect our readers to agree with everything that will appear within the pages of this publication, but we do trust that you will study out the information and that it will stimulate further Bible study. As one editor has so well said,

I hope anyone following after me will go further than I have gone in the search for truth, will see more of the Word of God than I have seen, and will explore where I never dreamt treasures were to be found.

The BSN has chronicled our journey into truth. Over the years of Scripture study, we have been led to great changes of understanding. Here are a few of the foundational transitions in realization that have been made over the decades:

- (1) Our Father is active in His Universe and is "operating ALL in accord with the counsel of His will" (Ephesians 1:11).
- 2. This was an outreach periodical, printed on newsprint, with the first issue having a printing of 20,000 copies, the second issue 15,000, etc.

- (2) We are clay in the hand of the divine Potter "Has not the Potter power over the clay?" (Romans 9:21).
- (3) "We are His workmanship" (Ephesians 2:10); "We are His achievement" (CV); "We are God's own handiwork" (WNT).
- (4) We are therefore "confident of this very thing, that He Who has begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ" (Philippians 1:6).
- (5) We know that, "for us, who love God, who are the called according to His purpose, there is an awareness that He is working all together for good" (Romans 8:28, *BSV*).

### The Church's Heavenly Character

by — Charles Henry Mackintosh (1820-1896)

During the greater part of the nineteenth century, there lived and labored in Great Britain a true and devoted servant of God, Charles Henry Mackintosh (1820-1896). He was one of the early Brethren, commonly called Plymouth Brethren. His chief writings are found in the six-volumes Notes on the Pentateuch, and the six-volumes *Miscellaneous Writings of C.H.M.* He never used his name in connection with his writings and to most of his readers he is known only by his initials "C.H.M." In 1850 he wrote a series of papers on *The Life and Times of* 

Elijah. In the final paper of this series under "Concluding Remarks" we find a strong testimony in confirmation of the unique ministry of Paul. This section is reprinted here as *The Church's Heavenly Character*. – Otis Q. Sellers (1901-1992)

# Enlightened Eyes

s stated earlier, it is of great value to understand what God is doing now. Again, there is the looming burden and fear of our mortality. Often it is difficult to understand why God would be so good to us. Why would He give to me such a high calling in Christ? Dare I hope to be lifted to such a position? What is the "catch" to be freely given such a celestial hope as jointheirship with Christ?

Look once again at the simple chart<sup>1</sup> in part two of this series. Notice in the chart that the original creation of the cosmos included only the celestial beings as the residents of heavenly places. Before you dismiss the idea of there being a portion of creation in place prior to the creation of man, try to remember places in Scripture where you learn of heavenly places. There are not too many of them (e.g. Job 38:4-7). In fact, you really don't think in terms of there being a residency out in the cosmos, because the issue starting from the very

beginning of Scripture is the making of the Earth: the creation of man and a habitat for mankind, the creatures in the sea, the creatures upon the land, the creatures in the air, and the lush foliage with which to exchange carbon monoxide for oxygen, the vast oceans, the warming sun, the reflective illumination of the moon, and the cleansing process of evaporation all set the stage for God to bring the Kingdom of Heaven down to Earth in a glorious display of blessing and power for humanity – blessing and power that will be vested in the chosen nation of Israel and brought to full fruition in the future coming ages.

If I asked you if you are "going to heaven," what would your response be? "I sure hope so?" Or maybe, "I sure know so!"

The idea that there was a portion of creation in place prior to the establishment of the Garden of Eden and the creation of man was thought by some to be an attempt at refuting the idea of evolution. This is true,

because the amount of time between the original creation of the cosmos (Genesis 1:1), the "without form and void" effect of "spiritual wickedness in high places" (:2), and the recreation of the Earth as stated (:3-31), in no way supports the teaching of evolution.

Rather, the "gap" of Genesis 1:2 gives insight into the ancient ones who occupy the heavenly places. The celestial immortal beings are ancient in contrast to mortal humanity. In fact, the recreation of the Earth and our solar system (:3-31) provided the sun and moon whereby humanity could mark the passing of the limited time they have – limited time that is the inherent definition of mortality. By missing the realization of the creation of the *original heavenly places*, with their celestial citizenry, many feel the need to defend a limited understanding of all of creation by limiting the actual time that all of creation has been in existence, and tethering all of creation to the time when Adam shows up. Typically, this defense is to hold to the six to eight thousand years that have transpired since the creation of man as the entirety of all created matter and the ensuing time progression. That is not so. There is more going on than just mankind.

I remind you here of the existence of the evil principalities and powers who considered themselves the winners at Calvary. They thought they had won when Christ died (cf. I Corinthians 2:8); yet they were unaware of the power wrought in Christ when God raised Him from the dead, power that assured for us, as joint-heirs with Christ, a future elimination of mortality. The advantage that "spiritual wickedness in high places" held as immortals was defeated in an open show at Calvary (Colossians 2:15).

Our coming immortality, as the very next ones (second only to Christ) to experience literal immortal resurrection power, as well as the resurrection power to all of creation to ensure that nothing will be lost, was a mystery kept secret from creation, especially the celestial beings. The Old Testament saints had faith that they would live again to experience unfulfilled promises, but they could not yet understand the resurrection empowerment and far reach of Calvary. The life, death and resurrection of Christ had not yet taken place, and its full impact had not yet been revealed.

We now have a distinct advantage in that we possess the completed Word of God (Colossians 1:25). We do not need to contend with life's burdens in ignorance of the full revelation of God's will for creation. This understanding is the source of gravity for your life; peace for your life; grace for your life - grace that you extend to yourself first, which in turn allows you to extend it to those with whom you interact.

Paul was commissioned to reveal this mystery and, with the fulfilling of Scripture contained in the books of Ephesians and Colossians, he revealed the far reach of Calvary all the way out into the heavenly places. The power of Calvary reaches all things whether they be things in Earth or things in Heaven. Our destiny in Christ to occupy the heavenly places was a secret that was withheld from "spiritual wickedness in high places." Think about that for a while and realize your true vocation.

For it pleased the Father that in Him should all fulness dwell; and, having made peace through the blood of His cross, by Him to reconcile all things (see Enlightened, last page)

The burning question is, What advantage was it to him? How did it affect his relation to Christ? What use did he make of it? What value did he place upon it? The answer is all contained in this one word – "refuse!"

Paul plainly tells us in I Timothy 2:4 that God,

wills that **all** mankind be saved and come into a realization of the truth (CV).

Then Paul, in that same letter to Timothy, declares that we rely on the living God Who is in fact "the Savior of ALL mankind."

Faithful is the saying and worthy of all welcome ... that we rely on the living God, **Who is the Savior of ALL mankind**, especially of believers (4:9-11).

This doesn't say that a "portion of mankind," or even "most of mankind," but "ALL mankind" WILL be saved.

"ALL" means "ALL."

That death is no barrier to God was dramatically demonstrated by the resurrection of Christ. Thus, Paul declares, For, to this end, Christ died and lived, in order that, **both of dead and living**, He might have Lordship (Romans 14:9, REB).

Wherefore, also, God highly exalts Him, and graces Him with the name that is above every name, that in the name of Jesus every knee should be bowing, celestial and terrestrial and subterranean, and every tongue should be acclaiming that Jesus Christ is Lord, for the glory of God, the Father (Philippians 2:9-11, CV).

There are absolutely no obstacles for God's love, not even death.

Neither death nor life ... will be able to separate (Romans 8:38-39, CV).

Therefore, Paul boldly proclaimed that divine "love never ends" (I Corinthians 13:8, HCSB).


