The Original Creation

he entire record of the original creation is given in the first verse of Genesis. "In the beginning God created the Heavens and the Earth." This is all that is revealed in the book of Genesis concerning the original creation. No information is here given which will help us set the date of creation; nothing is revealed concerning the method used by the divine architect; nothing is revealed to tell us whether this was a few thousand or a few million years ago. We are not told whether the Heaven and Earth were called into existence in a split second of time, or whether the process of their formation covered a long interval of time. Speculation here is useless and irreverent. The bare fact is given as a statement of truth to be received.

THE INFINITY PRINCIPLE

Here is an excellent example of the "infinity principle" of divine revelation. This principle is that God in His Word tells everything we need to know and gives all information necessary in the realm of the finite, but He confines Himself to simple declarations of fact in the realm of the infinite. By this, God teaches finite beings (men) to walk by faith in the unexplained infinite.

Traditional beliefs and teaching make it hard for many to see that there was a period of original creation, followed by a period of ruin long before the human race in Adam appeared on the scene. Most people confound the primitive creation of the first verse with the ruin into which it had fallen as revealed in the second verse. Genesis 1:2 should be translated "the Earth BECAME ..." instead of "the Earth was."

When it is thus translated the period of original creation is fully recognized. The Rotherham Version translates Genesis 1:2, "Now the Earth had become waste and wild."

GOD SETTLES THE MATTER

This matter can be settled by the Word of God. In Isaiah 45:18 we have the definite statement that God created the Earth "not in vain" but to be inhabited. The word used in this verse for "vain" is the same word used in Genesis 1:2. The latter verse says, "the Earth was without form and void," the former verse says "He created it not a void." Thus, we know from God's own exact statement that, when He created the Earth originally, it was not in the waste and empty condition in which we view it in Genesis 1:2.

We can rest assured that the original creation was worthy of the Creator Himself and that it reflected all of His perfections. In Deuteronomy 32:4 we are told, "He is the Rock, His work is perfect." This was certainly true of His creative work described in Genesis 1:1.

He created it to be inhabited; therefore, it was inhabited, for God's purposes do not fail. That it was inhabited is seen in the command of God to Adam to (see Original, last page)

Free Will Is a Myth

Robert Sapolsky

In Bible Student's Notebook 912 we shared the story of Sam Harris, a neuroscientist, who holds that "free will is an illusion." Though not a believer, his scientific finds were intriguing.

Likewise, Corinne Purtill writes in the Los Angeles Times, introducing us to Stanford University neurobiologist Robert Sapolsky (October 17, 2023), recent author of Determined: A Science of Life Without Free Will,

Sapolsky has reached the conclusion that virtually all human behavior is as far beyond our conscious control as the convulsions of a seizure, the division of cells, or the beating of our hearts.

This means accepting that a man who shoots into a crowd has no more control over his fate than the victims who happen to be in the wrong place at the wrong time. It means treating drunk drivers who barrel into pedestrians just like drivers who suffer a sudden heart attack and veer out of their

"The world is really screwed up and made much, much more unfair by the fact that we reward people and punish people for things they have no control over," Sapolsky said. "We've got no free will. Stop attributing stuff to us that isn't there."

"Free will is a myth, and the sooner we accept that, the more just our society will be."

"If it's impossible for any single neuron or any single brain to act without influence from factors beyond its control," Sapolsky argues, "there can be no logical room for free will."

"We know we make worse decisions when hungry, stressed or scared. We know our physical makeup is influenced by the genes inherited from distant ancestors and by our mothers' health during her pregnancy. Abundant evidence indicates that people who grew up in homes marked by chaos and deprivation will perceive the world differently and make different choices than people raised in safe, stable, resource-rich environments. A lot of important things are beyond our control."

But, like — everything? We have no meaningful command over our choice of careers, romantic partners or weekend plans? If you reach out right now and pick up a pen, was even that insignificant (see **EDITORIAL**, last page)

A Lifetime of Seeking Truth

i everyone! I'm Ken, and I'm 80 years old. I have a story to share about my long journey, trying to understand faith, truth, and the many different paths I've taken.

When I was a kid, Sundays at the Baptist Church were a big deal for my family. My mom didn't think I was listening to the sermons, but I was! I would even re-preach them at home using my little apple box as a pulpit. We had a blind man visit us, and we'd all sing while my brother played the guitar on our front porch.

Those were simple, yet deep moments. Even though I loved preaching, reading aloud in Sunday school was a bit tricky for me because I was shy. Our church changed from Missionary Baptist to Southern Baptist, but back then people cared more about being together and less about the name of their denomination.

After high school, I was in the Marine Corps for six

years and even spent time in Vietnam. I got married and had a son, but we got divorced, and I didn't see my son for over 30 years. When we found each other again, it was a real blessing, even though we missed so much time.

I spent about 25 years in the Worldwide Church of God. It was a place where I found some truth, but I kept looking for more even after the church suffered divisions. My wife, Betty, helped me look for more truths on the internet.

Then, I met Clyde, who loved bluegrass music and the Bible just like me. We talked about music and Scriptures, and I learned a lot about faith. I learned about Paul, the apostle, and it made sense to me, fitting with the truths I was looking for.

I believe that everyone will be saved, a truth that became clear after studying different teachings. I learned about the Waldensians, who believed a lot like Paul, and Abraham Lincoln, who also believed

Without Form and Void: A Study of the Meaning of Genesis 1:2

Considered a classic in Christian apologetics, this scholarly analysis of the biblical phrase "without form and void," from the opening chapter of Genesis, observes the rules of linguistics, grammar and syntax, and also examines how words are used in the rest of Scripture. This book has been described as the best argument that has ever been written for the Gap Theory.

A well respected Canadian scientist, and listed in the 1971 American Men in Science, Dr. Custance contends that we should not allow science to determine what Scripture says. Neither should we allow Scripture to determine what the scientist observes in the laboratory. Yet observed fact in the one cannot, ultimately, conflict with revealed fact in the other. Any conflict, then, is in the interpretation of the facts – not in the facts themselves.

No One Has Been Overlooked



The Inspiration of Ecclesiastes

This book formed part of the Hebrew Bible long before the time of Christ, and is therefore included in His Word, "the Scriptures" (Matthew 22:29; II Timothy 3:16, etc.). It is given in the list of canonical books by Josephus (A.D. 37), and is included in all of the Ancient Versions made before Christ. It has been rejected by some, or put to a late date, on account of its alleged Theology. Theology is man's reasoning about the Word of God, as Science is man's reasoning about the Works of God. Because Genesis does not agree with Science, that book is rejected by Rationalists. Because Ecclesiastes does not agree with Theology, this book is rejected, as uninspired, even by some Evangelical theologians.

True, the Bible contains an inspired record of what people said and did, and it does not follow that all that they said or did was inspired. Nevertheless, it is inconceivable that this can apply to a whole book, without a word of warning. Those who can imagine such a thing refuse the evidence that Christ in Luke 16:19-30 is using the language of His enemies, and in :31 giving His own Divine pronouncement. They strain out¹ the gnat and swallow the camel. They do not see that, if any one whole book is not a part of "THE ORACLES OF GOD," every Christian doctrine loses its foundation. There could have been in that case no Divine selection or preservation of books, and no Divine CANON OF

SCRIPTURE. If ONE book is thus ruled out, then another may be. Doubt is thus cast upon the whole Bible, and we have no "Word of God" at all! If this book is not part of the Word and words of God, then we have no reply to those who reject Genesis, Daniel, Jonah or the Apocalypse, who do so on the same ground of human reasoning. If the inner consciousness of each individual is to decide what is and what is not "Scripture," there is an end of Divine Revelation altogether.


