What Is Gain?

by — J. Philip Scranton

For to me to be living is Christ, and to be dying, gain (Philippians 1:21).

In accord with my premonition and expectation, that in nothing shall I be put to shame, but with all boldness, as always, now also Christ shall be magnified in my body, whether through life or through death. For to me to be living is Christ, and to be dying, gain. Now if it is to be living in flesh, this to me means fruit from work, and what I shall be preferring I am not making known. (Yet I am being pressed out of the two, having a yearning for the solution and to be together with Christ, for it, rather, is much better.) Yet to be staying in the flesh is more necessary because of you (Philippians 1:20-24, CV).

his passage is frequently explained to mean that Paul believed martyrdom would usher him into the bliss of Heaven. That view is wrong for several reasons.

First, such a view is in disagreement with other statements by Paul.

Second, Paul is not interested in personal gain. If he lives, he lives to serve Christ. If he dies, he will be a martyr for the cause of Christ, and he expects his death to further the gospel. The "gain" Paul speaks of is gain for the cause of Christ. This thought is consonant with the earlier verses of the chapter, where he expresses his desire to be released from jail so he can evangelize. Yet he is rejoicing that his confinement has generated so much attention to his position that others are evangelizing because of his absence, and the total effect is a larger work than he could accomplish himself, if he were free.

The third reason that this passage does not mean that Paul expected death to bring him "gain" is because his desire is for a completely different solution. Paul clearly says that he will not reveal whether he thinks

evangelizing or martyrdom is better. Instead, he is "pressed out of the two" (:23) He preferred neither evangelizing nor martyrdom. He preferred "to be together with Christ, for it, rather, is much better" (:23). Paul yearns to be in the presence of Christ. He echoes the same sentiment here as in II Corinthians 5, and he lends no support to the idea that there is any bliss or

benefit in death. In I Corinthians 15:32 Paul poses the question, If I were to be killed by the beasts in the Ephesian arena, "what is the benefit to me, if the dead are not being roused?" (I Corinthians 15:32). Blessedness is resurrection and glorification, not death.

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Our Manifestation with Christ in Glory: That Which Immediately Precedes Christ's Day

Ken Points:

he Day of Christ" will initiate His Kingdom (Basileia). This is the next event on God's prophetic clock. This marks His assumption of manifest sovereignty over the nations.

Very little is written about this future day when there will be a worldwide acknowledgement that Jesus Christ is Lord to the Glory of God the Father. The diligent student can identify "The Day of Christ" in the purposes of God. Let this tidbit be a starting point in the understanding of what "The Day of Christ" is, and when it dawns.

The Lord Jesus told the Pharisees,

Your father Abraham rejoiced to see My Day: and he saw it, and was glad (John 8:56).

Jesus Christ said that Abraham saw (*i.e.*, perceived) His Day. How did Abraham "see" His Day? God re-

vealed Christ's Day to him; hence, Abraham saw the Day of Christ, by faith, and was "glad." Likewise, the Bible student ought to "see" Christ's Day and be glad.

Notice Paul's references to this day.

Who shall also confirm you unto the end, that you may be blameless in **the Day of our Lord Jesus Christ** (I Corinthians 1:8).

To deliver such an one unto Satan for the destruction of the flesh, that the spirit may be saved in **the Day of the Lord Jesus** (I Corinthians 5:5).

As also you have acknowledged us in part, that we are your rejoicing, even as you also are ours in **the Day of the Lord Jesus** (II Corinthians 1:14).

The Four Days of Scripture (A Compilation)

The Bible speaks of four different days in the sense of long periods of time. Each one of these days marks a separate and distinct period of time. These are not meaningless expressions. They are: (1) "Man's Day," (2) "The Day of Christ," (3) "The Day of the Lord," and (4) "The Day of God." The good workmen will identify the four days, and then "rightly divide" them (II Timothy 2:15).

This is a composite work from seven authors: Tom L. Ballinger, Dr. Robert A. Hadden (1868-1939), David R. Hettema, Dr. C.E. McLain (1909-1990), Clyde L. Pilkington, Jr., W.B. Screws (1884-1961) and Otis Q. Sellers (1901-1992).

Being confident of this very thing, that He which has begun a good work in you will perform it until the Day of Jesus Christ (Philippians 1:6).

That you may approve things that are excellent; that you may be sincere and without offence till *the Day of Christ* (Philippians 1:10).

Holding forth the word of life; that I may rejoice in the Day of Christ, that I have not run in vain, neither labored in vain (Philippians 2:16).

However, "The Day of Christ" is preceded by His Appearing, His Manifestation in Glory (Colossians 3:4). This is when our present hope of the calling of the Mystery is realized. This is when our faith gives way to sight. This is when Christ Jesus, in His role as the Head of the high calling, convenes [calls into session] "the Ecclesia, which is His Body."

As the Great Convoker,1 He calls His Ecclesia into session, which marks His assumption of sovereignty over the Heavens and the Earth. Those who have been membered into "the high calling of God in *Christ Jesus*" will be raised *out* from among the dead,² changed from mortal to immortal, and will take their place, or station, in His Celestial Government.

For nearly two-thousand years now, Christ has been silently building His Ecclesia, the One Body. Ever

since Acts 28, He has been preparing the chosen and called, establishing them on the grounds of Present Truth. The religious "Christian world" is unaware of this secret work. Most Christians believe that Christ is actively building a visible church, and they are unaware that the visible church is the work and contrivance of men.

The outstanding characteristic of the Church over which Christ Jesus alone is the Head, is that the Lord Jesus Christ holds all Preeminence!

And He is the Head of the Body, the Church: Who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all He might have the preeminence (Colossians 1:18).



One God and Father of all, Who is over all and through all and in all (Ephesians 4:6, CV).

Key Points:

The doctrine of Christ's deity is a manmade concept that contradicts Scripture, diminishes the glory of God and Jesus, and aligns with pagan beliefs integrated into Christian doctrine................8474

It might seem odd that this lesson would be titled "One God," for surely everyone knows that to be the case. So, on the surface this would seem to be a rather simple declarative statement about which all Christianity would agree – that is, until one delves further into just what Christianity really thinks about this little phrase "One God."

Think of a simple math problem: 1+1+1=1. No, this isn't the new math taught in schools. This is the math that Christianity uses, for you see, this system assigns deity not only to the Father, but also to the Son, as well as the so-called Holy Spirit which is deemed to be the third person of Christianity's famed trinity.

Old Testament and New Testament writers in many places declare that God is "one." He is the One True

God Who is Creator, Sustainer and Placer, among other descriptive terms used to describe Him.

... Yahweh, He is the only Elohim. There is no one else aside from Him (Deuteronomy 4:35, CV).

... *Yet He is one* ... (Job 23:13, *CV*).

Old Testament writers were not the only authors to declare the oneness of God. In I Timothy 2:5 Paul declares,

For there is **one God**, and one mediator of God and mankind, a Man, Christ Jesus ... (CV).

The Importance of Right Division

[*To G.B.*:] Every supposed difficulty in Scripture is resolved by either right division, right translation, or right interpretation. In the case of your questions, they are answered by *right division*. While all of the Scriptures are written for our benefit, they are not all written to or about us.

Not everything in the Scriptures is the same. There are different ages, administrations, gospels, days, callings, hopes, spheres of glory, resurrections, etc. We must learn to make a difference where God makes a difference.

Paul instructed Timothy about "rightly dividing" or "correctly partitioning the Word of Truth" (II Timothy 2:15, CV, 1930). He wrote to the Philippians, "for you to distinguish the things that differ" (1:10, GLT).

Thus, Miles Coverdale (1488-1568) wrote,

It shall greatly help thee to understand Scripture, if thou mark not only what is spoken or written, but of whom, and unto whom, with what words, at what time, where, to what intent, with what circumstance, considering what goeth before, and what followeth after.

Simply put, the four Gospels and the book of Acts, and those epistles written during that time, concern Israel and her coming Kingdom. After they were set aside in Acts 28, Paul was granted the revelation of God's current purpose, which is the Administration of the Secret.

For a study of *right division* I would encourage you to begin with the "Right Division" series, both in the articles in the *Bible Student's Notebook*, as well as the

Their blindness to truth can be quite a heaviness to us. We would so love for them to be liberated from their great darkness. Yet even if we had the perfect short answer to all their many individual doctrinal issues, they would still not be able to see, unless Father granted them realization - the eyes to see, "the eyes of their understanding being enlightened" (cf. Ephesians 1:18).

Yet, what lies behind all of these individual doctrinal issues that you shared is a misunderstanding of God Himself. Instead, they see a "god" who is not the true source of all, including salvation and security. Once we ever catch a glimpse of the true God of Scripture, all self-righteousness and judgment begin to fade away. So, perhaps the best aid toward enlightenment is concerning God Himself.

Yet, again, even if we had the clearest presentation available, it will be of no avail, without Father's perfect timing of illumination in their lives. All that we can do is plant a seed, and water it, but it is God who gives that seed life, and growth, and fruit. And even then, like ourselves, it is a long journey of realization. Having said this, one simple work that readily comes to mind concerning an adjusted view of God is our abridged revision of Hannah Whitall Smith's *The* <u>God of All Comfort</u>.² It is an outstanding work.

The intention herein is to present an alternative view to the confusing message of the traditional Evangelical concept of prophecy, thus opening the door to a consideration of the idea of a Pre-millenni-

al Kingdom as the fulfillment of many of God's promises to Israel to have their kingdom in the Earth. All of the material in this book, taken together, is a wonderful resolution to the confusion of the conventional religious theology that has muddled the minds of sincere Bible students for centuries. While we may live in the Secret Administration, that doesn't necessarily mean that God's Word regarding His plans for Israel must be a mystery to us.

Other references in the Scriptures indicating God being one are Deuteronomy 6:4; Mark 12:29, 32; Galatians 3:20; I Corinthians 8:5-6; James 2:19 and Ephesians 4:5-6.

Assigning deity to Christ Jesus brings with it a whole host of problems of their own. For example, if, as Christianity says, Christ Jesus is God and He is the second person of this trinity, since there is only "one God," what happened to the Universe when Christ died? Who was running it? Who kept it together and kept it from falling apart? Did God die? If Christ Jesus is God, then God died. How can that be? This then exposes another secret of Christianity, that this religious system doesn't really believe that a person dies – when they die.

What is this all about? Religion has a difficult time understanding basic realities of life and death. When one dies, they are dead. The definition of death is the absence of life (see Genesis 3:19; Psalm 104:29; 115:17; Ecclesiastes 3:19-20; 6:6; 9:2, 5). One can't be partially dead or mostly dead. They are either dead or not. One can be near death, or as the expression goes, having "one foot in the grave," but they are not dead – close to death, but not dead.

Contrarily, Christianity believes that once the breath passes out of us, we then travel to another plane of existence. Hence, we never die, and Christ Jesus didn't die on the stake. He was released from His body and went to this imaginary place called "hell" and supposedly preached to the spirits or people or whoever until He reoccupied


His body and was raised from the "dead." This is how Christianity can try to reconcile the "death" on the stake and the idea that Christ is God. You see, Christ didn't die and therefore God didn't die. This just takes us further and further away from the truth and into pagan and manmade dogma and teaching.

Wouldn't it be far easier and much sounder to let the Scriptures speak for themselves instead of trying to force manmade teachings into what God's Word says? The doctrine of the supposed deity of Christ is one of those manmade teachings that undermines the Scriptures, detracts from the glory of God the Father, and His Son Christ Jesus, and feeds into pagan teachings, much of which has been incorporated into "Christian doctrine." The next lesson will look into the origins of this doctrine.


Will We Escape Death?
