hristianity will proudly proclaim from the rooftops that God is the creator of all (well, almost all), and that He is the sustainer of it all. In other words, He created it all and He keeps things working, at least in the physical material world. He keeps the atoms from exploding and the physical laws intact such as gravity or inertia, etc. Christianity has no issue with God being the author of all of this.

The problem arises when God happens to intrude into the lives of His creatures, for they falsely assume that each person has their own "free will" and lives independently of God, and that they only "allow" God in their lives, by their own "choosing," when they need something from Him and it is convenient for them to do so. Yet, this is pure fantasy, making the creatures the god of their own lives. It is arrogance that produces an illusion like this.

The Apostle Paul has a great deal to say about this in

his letter to the saints at Ephesus. At the beginning of his letter, Paul tells us in Ephesians 1:11 (CV) that God is "the One Who is operating all in accord with the council of His will." Notice the word "all." All means all, and a little child can grasp this concept. Unfortunately, little children grow into adults, and as that transition takes place, these little children fall under an increasingly greater influence of adults and the religious systems, to the end that they become just like their parents and religious leaders. This is Satan's job. In Ephesians 4:9-14 Paul warns us not to be minors (see BSC, last page)

# The Odyssey of B.A. Russell

(as interviewed by Steve Martin)

# From Fire and Brimstone to Universal Salvation

Russell's spiritual journey is a compel $oldsymbol{\Lambda}_ullet$  ling tale of transformation, marked by a profound shift from the fire and brimstone teachings of his youth to a peaceful acceptance of universal salvation.

Raised in a Southern Baptist community, his early years were steeped in a religion that emphasized sin, damnation and the fear of hell. The revivals he attended were intense, instilling a deep fear of eternal punishment and emphasizing the need for salvation to avoid damnation. This fire and brimstone approach dominated Russell's formative years, laying a foundation of fear and strict doctrinal adherence.

His first significant religious transition occurred upon marrying a Church of Christ member, introducing him to differing interpretations of Christianity. This sparked a curiosity that led him to question his ingrained beliefs.

Russell's journey took him through various denominations and teachings. After his exposure to the Church of Christ, he found himself drawn to the Independent Baptist Church, influenced by notable figures such as Jerry Falwell. He later discovered the teachings of Peter Ruckman, a staunch proponent of

the King James Version, which further anchored his belief in this translation.

However, his exploration continued as he delved into the Grace Movement, guided by teachers like Richard Jordan and later E.C. Moore. This phase marked a significant shift in Russell's understanding of Christian doctrine, equipping him to move away from the fear-based teachings of his youth.

As B.A. Russell continued his in-depth exploration of church doctrine, he increasingly found that many of its tenets did not resonate with his understanding or feel congruent with his inner sense of truth. Despite his extensive study and genuine efforts to comprehend various theological positions, he frequently encountered doctrines that seemed contradictory or implausible. This dissonance extended beyond intellectual disagreements; it was a profound feeling that something fundamental was amiss. The more he delved into the intricacies of traditional teachings, the more he realized that many aspects simply didn't align with his evolving perception of a loving and iust God.

This internal conflict was not just about reconciling different interpretations of Scripture, but about an in-

herent feeling that much of what he had been taught and what he read did not sit right with his soul. This deep-seated unease propelled him further on his spiritual journey, seeking a faith and understanding that felt authentic and true to his core beliefs.

Throughout his journey, Russell's beliefs underwent significant evolution. A critical aspect of this transformation was his rejection of the doctrine of the Trinity, a concept deeply ingrained in his early religious teachings. This shift was not easy, as the idea of the Trinity had been a fundamental aspect of his understanding of God.

Another pivotal change in his belief system was his unwavering belief in the sovereignty of God. This belief became a cornerstone of his faith, emphasizing God's ultimate control and purpose in all aspects of existence. It was a comforting thought that aligned with his newfound belief in the universal salvation of all souls, reinforcing the idea that God's love and mercy extend to everyone without exception.

Additionally, Russell's understanding of the nature of death evolved significantly. Moving away from the traditional view of death as a gateway to eternal damnation or reward, he came to see it as a temporary state, awaiting resurrection. This perspective brought him a sense of peace, aligning with his belief in a just and loving God Who ultimately intends to save all.

The discovery of the book Martin Zender Goes to Hell played a crucial role in shaping Russell's new beliefs. The book was instrumental in his acceptance of the doctrine of universal salvation, offering a stark contrast to the fear-laden teachings of his youth. Zender's work opened Russell's mind to the idea that God's love might extend to all humanity, irrespective of their beliefs or actions.

B.A. Russell noted a stark inconsistency in the conduct of Baptist preachers, particularly evident at funerals. Known for their hellfire and brimstone sermons, these preachers often softened their stance significantly when eulogizing the deceased, assuring mourners of the departed's heavenly afterlife regardless of their earthly deeds. This shift, which Russell found both ironic and humorous, highlighted a disconnect: preachers who fervently preached about eternal damnation seemed unable to face the implications of these beliefs during the solemnity of funerals. To Russell, this practice underscored the incongruity between harsh doctrines and the human need for comfort and hope, further driving his skepticism of traditional religious teachings.

Another pivotal moment occurred when Clyde Pilkington, a figure he respected, shifted from a staunch King James Version only stance to a more open consideration of various Bible translations. Initially, Russell was resistant to this change. The King James Bible had been a cornerstone of his belief system for so long that questioning its supremacy felt almost heretical. However, curiosity and a deep yearning for truth led him to reconsider his stance.

This change, however, came at a cost. His evolving beliefs led to a dwindling congregation at his church, which he renamed to reflect his new understanding. The church, initially called Victory Independent



Baptist Church, was renamed to Grace Believer Bible Church. This change, along with his new teachings, didn't sit well with many, leading to a significant decrease in attendance. B.A.'s rejection of fundamental doctrines like eternal damnation and the inerrancy of the *King James Bible* was too radical for many of his followers, resulting in an empty church.

Today, Russell's study includes numerous Bible versions and Greek dictionaries. This diverse collection of Scriptures and scholarly tools reflects his journey from a singular, rigid interpretation to a more complete and comprehensive understanding of the Bible. His approach to Scripture is now characterized by exploration and comparison, seeking deeper insights from a variety of sources.

In his later years, B.A. Russell finds immense peace and joy in his belief in the universal salvation of all souls. This profound conviction lifts the burdensome pressure he once felt to ensure the salvation of others, as he now trusts in God's overarching plan of redemption for everyone. This belief offers him a profound sense of reassurance, especially as he navigates the challenging aftermath of his exposure to Agent Orange, which has led to numerous cancers and heart complications.

in the faith, because minors will be blown about by any wind of doctrine espoused by the religious system. Satan is operating all of this (*cf.* II Corinthians 11:14-15), and he is using this system to formulate the "view to the systematizing of the deception" (Ephesians 4:14, CV).

However, this is exactly what God has planned, and He is working His plan with precision. God is in the business of deceiving people and blinding them when and as He sees fit, and He uses Satan for this purpose. Satan is every bit a servant of God (Job 2:6), as Paul was, or anyone else for that matter. He just has a very different role.


So, regardless of how things may appear, God is in complete control of His Universe, and because He is Creator and Sustainer of the Universe, He is totally responsible for what goes on in it. He is responsible for and to every living creature in the Universe past, present and future. He is well qualified for this responsibility, seeing that He created it all; and when He did, He had a purpose and plan in doing so (The Logos - John chapter 1). God is not the angry god that religion portrays, but is the God of love, mercy and grace, and every decision that He made is to bring Him glory and to be for our (humanity's) benefit. God isn't currently making any more decisions, because all those decisions were made before the disruption of the world (Ephesians 1:4 CV). We are all (including Satan) playing a part in God's grand play and each part is orchestrated by God Himself, and not one single being (human or celestial, Ephesians 3:20), will get their part wrong.

God is under no external compulsion or obligation to let us know how these parts fit together universally. For now, we have "the spirit which is of God, that we may be perceiving that which is being graciously given to us by God" (I Corinthians 2:12; cf. Ephesians 2:7) – but the details He has chosen to keep to Himself, for now (see Acts 1:7 for an example of Father's divine prerogative). Later, no doubt, we will all be wide-eyed in astonishment at what Father has done and by what He has made us to be after our resurrection (i.e., the Complement [Greek, Pleroma] of Christ Himself, Ephesians 1:23; 3:19). We can rest in the fact that our Heavenly Father loves us so much that He has chosen, in Himself, to be solely responsible for the work of His hands.
